What is The Western Front Association?

The object of The Western Front Association - the WFA - is to educate the public in the history of The Great War, with particular reference to the Western Front.

Founded on 11 November 1980 by historian John Giles, the WFA has grown to include many thousands of members world-wide.

Become an Overseas Supporter

The WFA offers non-UK residents the opportunity to become an 'Overseas Supporter'. This will entitle the individual to receive all issues of *Stand To!* published by the WFA (from the date of joining) for just £26.00 per year (2010); these will be posted out to the Overseas Supporter's address. In addition, new subscribers will be sent the most recent copy of *Stand To!* as soon as an application is received, which means four copies of *Stand To!* will be sent in the first year.

Stand To!

Stand To! is the WFA's acclaimed flag-ship in-house journal. It is not available to the general public and is normally only available to WFA members. It is typically 56 pages long, published in A4 size and despatched in January, May and September. Its pages are filled with cutting-edge articles about all aspects of the Great War (there is very little advertising).

Although a substantial number of articles deal with units or individuals involved in the fighting on the Western Front, articles written by international contributors about other fronts and aspects of the First World War have been featured. These have included pieces on the war at sea, German Zeppelin raids, the story of medical services on the Aisne and a major feature on the fate of British soldiers stranded behind German lines after the retreat of 1914 and executed as spies by the Germans.

Regular features include those on 'War Art' of the First World War period and The Camera Returns, an analysis of 'then and now' photographs from the war years, in addition to a comprehensive section of book reviews of recent publications. There is also a lively section of correspondence in which letters from Overseas Supporters would be warmly welcomed – some of this has been incredibly helpful in making suggestions about the possible identity of the black British PoW featured on the front cover of a recent edition.

How to Subscribe

If you would prefer to send a cheque in your local currency, we would request you do so for by adding £10 to the subscription of £26, making the sum due of £36 before converting to your local currency (this is necessary to partly offset bank charges for handling overseas cheques).
